Follow-up Inspection of Lockyer Power Project Site

On 15 November 2023 I conducted a follow-up inspection of the Lockyer Power Station Project Site, to confirm the completion of the minor property maintenance repairs set out in the minor works contract issued to J.M. Horrigan, and I can report:

The 10m wide fence maintenance lines (i.e., “firebreaks”) along the western, northern, and eastern boundaries of Lot 101 CSH2361 (approximately 2,690 lineal metres) have been mown.



The full width of the 10m wide pipeline easement along and inside the southern boundary of the property (along and adjacent to the koala-proof fence) has recently been mowed by a separate contractor at the direction of the pipeline operator. This includes the 3m wide strip that is required by the EPBC approval for the Lockyer Power Project.



The area which was cleared of trees in September 2021 (the 15.92ha approved project footprint) and which contained a number (a few hundreds) of eucalyptus regrowth suckers, has been mown using two tractor mounted heavy duty rotary slashers.



The two damaged steel posts on the northern boundary fence and the broken barbed wire near the north-eastern gate have been repaired by Horrigan Slashing. A damaged wire in the eastern fence-line was identified and repaired by the contractor.



The damage to the gate in the koala-proof fence at the south-eastern corner of the property has been repaired.



All the work was completed by 15th November 2023.
